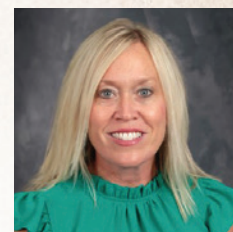

They went out to compete, night in night out, and they encouraged one another and represented their

families, our school, and this community with class. Way to go, Lady Raider Volleyball! Additionally, our student section for the Third Region Tournament was second to none. They were in unison, cheering loudly and with such enthusiasm that there were concerns that the bleachers at Owensboro Catholic High School could not hold them! The communities of Knottsville and Whitesville came to support the Lady Raiders in their quest to win the Third Region Title, and our crowds were by far the most impressive throughout the week.

I'm a native Indiana Hoosier (don't hold that against me), graduated from the University of Evansville, currently reside in Rockport, IN, and have worked in interscholastic and collegiate athletics for the last five years. My journey in athletics has taken me across the country to many different schools, rural and urban, public and private, large and small. However, I feel fortunate to have landed here in Whitesville. This community is a strong one that loves its school and steps up to the plate when called upon. Community support is the backbone of every interscholastic athletic department and school, and this community certainly excels in that category.

Lots of exciting things have been taking place in the athletic department over the course of the last few months. First, one of the most exciting things we've seen this semester is a return to a degree of normalcy at athletic contests. The bleachers are out, the parking lot is full, and fans have returned to the Horn Community Center to watch our athletes compete. It is so great to see fans return to the stands to cheer on the Raiders! As aforementioned, this school community truly bleeds blue and always shows up to support our student-athletes.

This semester has also boasted strong performances by our teams and athletes in competition. Our Lady Raiders volleyball team had a historic season on the court. The Lady Raiders broke many individual records, finished with a 27-6 overall record, and matched the 1999 softball team for the deepest postseason run in school history. Our girls won the 12th district championship in convincing fashion, then went on to defeat Owensboro Catholic and Meade County

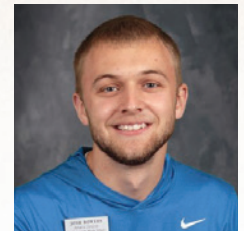
in the regional tournament before falling to Daviess Co. in the regional championship game. This team was so enjoyable to watch compete, and the crowds we had at the regional tournament substantially topped that of any other school present. The 2021 Lady Raider volleyball team will certainly be one that is remembered for years to come!

In addition to our volleyball team, we saw success on the cross country course. Sophomore runner Jacob Howard qualified for the state finals in cross country and placed 42nd out of 265 runners at the state finals. What an accomplishment!

This year has been a year of firsts for the athletic department as well. We welcomed our first girl golfer in school history with the addition of senior Makenna Greenwell to the golf team. Makenna was able to compete alongside the boys in several matches and represented Trinity in the regional golf tournament at Madisonville Country Club. Additionally, we are in the process of adding a new program. This spring, Trinity High School plans to launch the school's first ever bass fishing team. Bass fishing is a sanctioned KHSAA sport-activity and has a sponsored state championship. We are so excited about this addition to the department and look forward to the success our student-athletes will have! Finally, we also plan to have our first junior varsity baseball team in many years this spring.

In addition to all of our success in competition, many positive additions have occurred behind the scenes as well. Trinity High School announced a partnership with German-American Bank, who graciously sponsored our Blue/White Night a few weeks ago. The athletic department has partnered with the NFHS Network to live stream every athletic contest in the Horn Community Center for years to come. The department has also just launched a brand new athletics website ([www.trinityraiders.com](http://www.trinityraiders.com)) which will house schedules, results, rosters,

pictures, and more for all of our teams.



So many positive things have happened across our campus over the last few months, and Trinity Athletics is no exception. As we move into the winter and spring sports seasons, I know that we will continue to see success both on the court/field and in the classroom from our student-athletes. 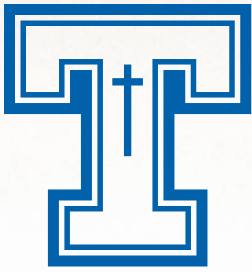

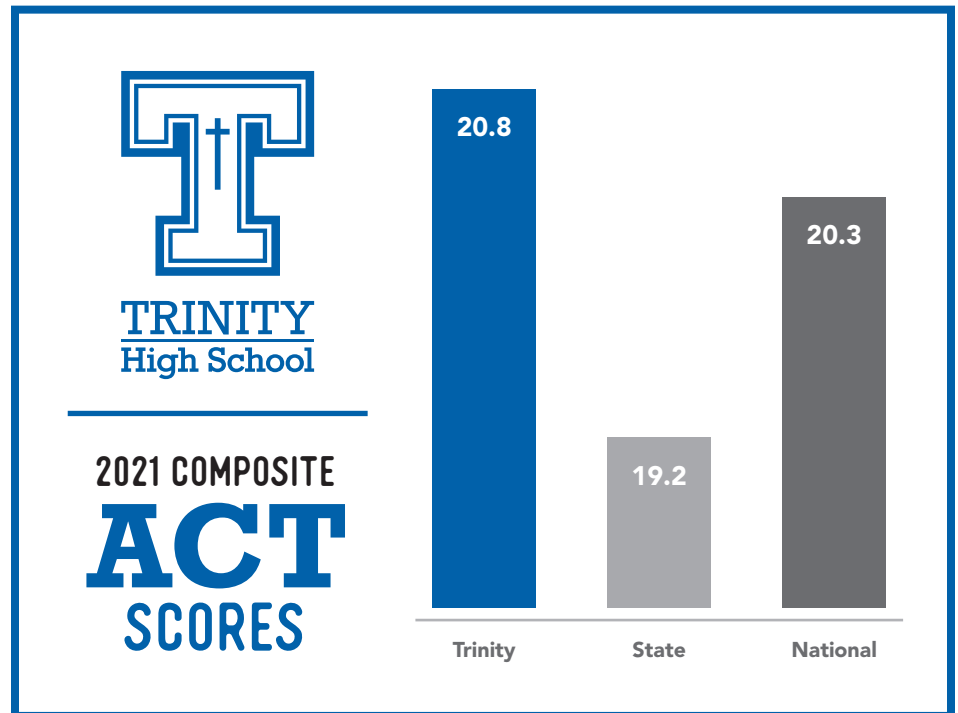
