

Hello Raiders! I pray all is well. There has been so much excitement in the last year at Trinity High School. I am happy to tell you about the many updates!

First, Trinity is working to build a new school! We had a 70% approval rating from the parish survey and the Diocese of Owensboro approved for us to move forward with the capital campaign. This is such exciting news for us, and we thank everyone for supporting this necessary endeavor. Frankly, we are outgrowing our school and looking forward to a new building that can house all students who want a Catholic education in east Daviess County!

We are excited to announce that we have been working diligently to improve our curriculum over the last five years, and the work is really paying off. This year we had several students make the 25+ Club for ACT. Those seniors who made the 25+ Club are Lanacia Evans, Natalie Rhinerson, Nichole Rhinerson and Bailey Wright. The underclassmen who made the 25+ Club were Nick Goetz, Georgia Howard, EJ Stauffer and Sienece Valdez. Senior Taylor Pedley made the 30+ Club. Congratulations to all these students on their academic achievements. We are proud of you! In addition, in the last five years we have updated books for religion, Spanish, science, English, and social studies classes. We are using My Math Lab (an online program) to differentiate learning in math, and all teachers received ACT training in July 2021. We have made curriculum development a focus, and we are seeing results!

In 2020, Maddie Brasher-Evans was hired to teach history, but she has a double major in history and theater. She resurrected our drama class, and we produced plays in the springs of the last two years. She is doing a fantastic job with our drama students! If you did not see DeeAnna Wathen's student art exhibit, you truly missed out. The students' artwork was phenomenal! Nichole Rhinerson won the People's Choice Award with her drawing of Elvis. Congratulations, Nichole! Improving the Fine Arts Program has been a focus for Trinity High School!

We continue to make physical improvements to our building. Last summer there was a cafeteria renovation, and we finished painting the final classrooms at Trinity High School, so all parts of the building have been painted within the last four years. We also received a grant to update all lockers, so we have 105 new full-size lockers in the school. We do our best to give our students the best learning environment possible and will continue to do so!

Finally, and most importantly, we continue to work on our mission of fostering discipleship! Every year at graduation, we present a Christian Witness Award. Greetings! I hope this message finds you well! The 2021-2022 school year has come to a close, and with it comes a host of things for which we can be thankful. This school year was a "return to normalcy" in K-12 education, especially here at Trinity High School. Students were able to participate in all their normal activities; fans were able to freely come and go at games; and we made it through the year without any major shutdowns.

In the athletic department, this year has brought a tremendous amount of success. In the second semester alone, our boys basketball team made it to the regional tournament for the first time in several years; our softball and archery teams continued to compete at a high level; the Raiderette dance team has returned; new LED scoreboards for the baseball and softball fields have been ordered; and, for the first time in school history, bass fishing has been competing as a sport. In fact, in just its first year as a program, the team sent a boat to the KHSAA state finals! What an amazing accomplishment!

While there has been success on the field, Trinity has also seen success off the field. The department presented more than 70 KHSAA Academic All-State Awards to student-athletes in May. Additionally, we recognized four student-athletes who received the Triple Threat Award for playing three varsity sports, one in each of three different seasons. These accomplishments continue to be an example of how our

student-athletes not only succeed on the playing surface, but also in the classroom and the community.



While the end of the school year brings the end of an era for our seniors, this year it also brings an end for myself and the department. I will be stepping down as athletic director for Trinity High School. I received an opportunity to further my career in interscholastic athletics and have taken a job back home in Indiana. While my time at Trinity was short, I will never forget the people I have met here. I will certainly miss the warm, smiling faces of Bryce and Sue Roberts stopping by my office every morning in the Horn Center as they walk. I will miss my co-workers as they are some of the hardest-working people I know, working to make this school community function. I am proud of everything we have been able to accomplish this past year, and I know the sports programs at Trinity will continue to be successful for years to come. With increased enrollment and the promise of a new school on the horizon, the sky is the limit for Trinity athletics, and I am proud to have been a small part of it.
