Trinity Raiders basketball, coached by Nathan West, had an exciting season this year, ending their season with 14 wins and 16 losses, and the Lady Raiders basketball team, coached by Emily Hernandez, went 3-25.

We also welcomed two new coaches to our spring sports this year, and they both had great first seasons. The Trinity Raiders baseball team welcomed former Kentucky Wesleyan College baseball player Ethan Maxey this season, and he helped guide the Raiders to a 9-16 record and a regional tournament appearance. Trinity alum and former St. Catherine College softball player Carrie Wilkerson took over the Lady Raiders softball coaching position, and she helped lead the team to a 14-9 record.

The Bass Fishing team, Coached by BJ Fitzgerald, had a successful season this year. The team advanced to the State Tournament at Kentucky Lake on May 12th & 13th. Two boats qualified to attend and took 60th & 61st place.

The Trinity Archery team (youth age group), coached by Rodney Rhodes, had a full, busy season. During indoor competition, they had two 3rd-place finishes. They brought home some hardware at Ohio County (2nd place) and at the Owensboro Archery Club Regional 3D Tournament (3rd place). The team is preparing for the State and National Championships in June. Good Luck!

Boys volleyball started up in March and were able to get in three tournaments this year and played at the state tournament in Lexington where they made it to the Gold Final by being in the top 6 teams. The new team is coached by Molly Wathen (husband, Trinity Alum Dakota

Wathen). Molly went to Lindsey Wilson College, where she played volleyball.



This year, we brought back the Alumni Basketball Tournament, and we had a great turnout for the entire event. The gym was full of excitement for all three days. In the last few weeks, I have heard so many students say the same thing, “I went to Mrs. Williams

through college to get help with math.” She established relationships with students and when she said, “If you need help, call me,” she truly meant it!

Ms. Williams was the feet of God on this earth. She walked right over to the gym to start the very first Trinity girls’ basketball team and walked to the softball field to coach for many years. She walked around the classroom and made sure we were on task, but made us use our feet to come up and ask questions at her desk.

Ms. Williams used her hands to bless us all with Katie burgers and red Kool-Aid. She also used them to show us problems on the board and how to strum a guitar. She used her hands to pitch us softballs when she coached, and even took a line drive off the eye as she was pitching to us, and just kept going. She was as tough as they come on the field and in the classroom, but one thing is for certain, we all knew she loved us.

Ms. Williams was a beloved wife, mother, sister, aunt and teacher to all. She had the ability to make you work your hardest and learn a great deal, all while showing us how much she loved us. During one of our last visits she told me, “Tell the students I love them. Please tell them not to be sad. I lived a great life and, I want them to as well.” Ms. Williams was a good and faithful servant of the Lord and if

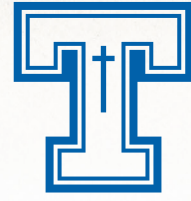
